We have some outstanding photographers who are taking some amazingly clever compositions in the photo group.

Teachers and classes are starting the preparation for our whole school performance at the end of next term where our students acting, musical and dance skills will be on full show.

Then we have our sporting teams who continue to do well in PSSA knockouts. Our netball and soccer teams are lining up for more games and we have had some wonderful individual performances in representative trials as well.

We have a lot to be very proud of as a school in the activities our students are given the opportunity to participate in.

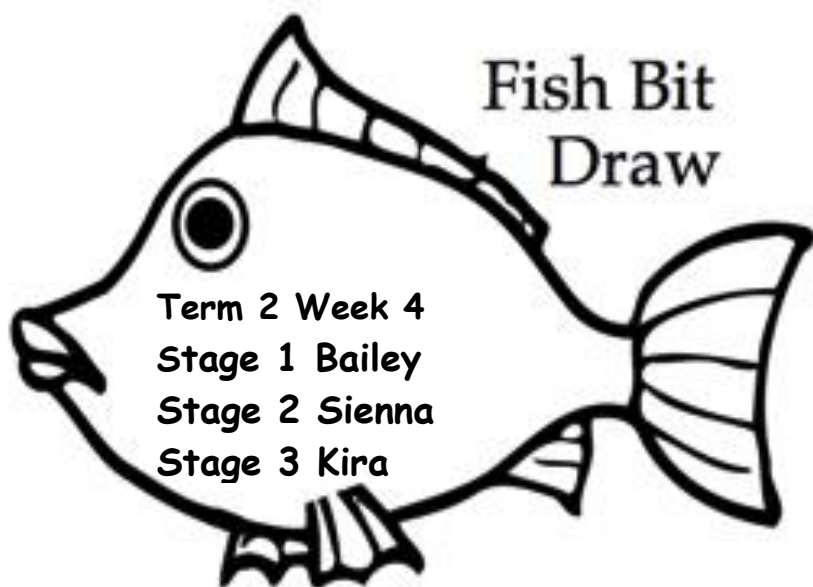

Year 1 Banksia Village Visit

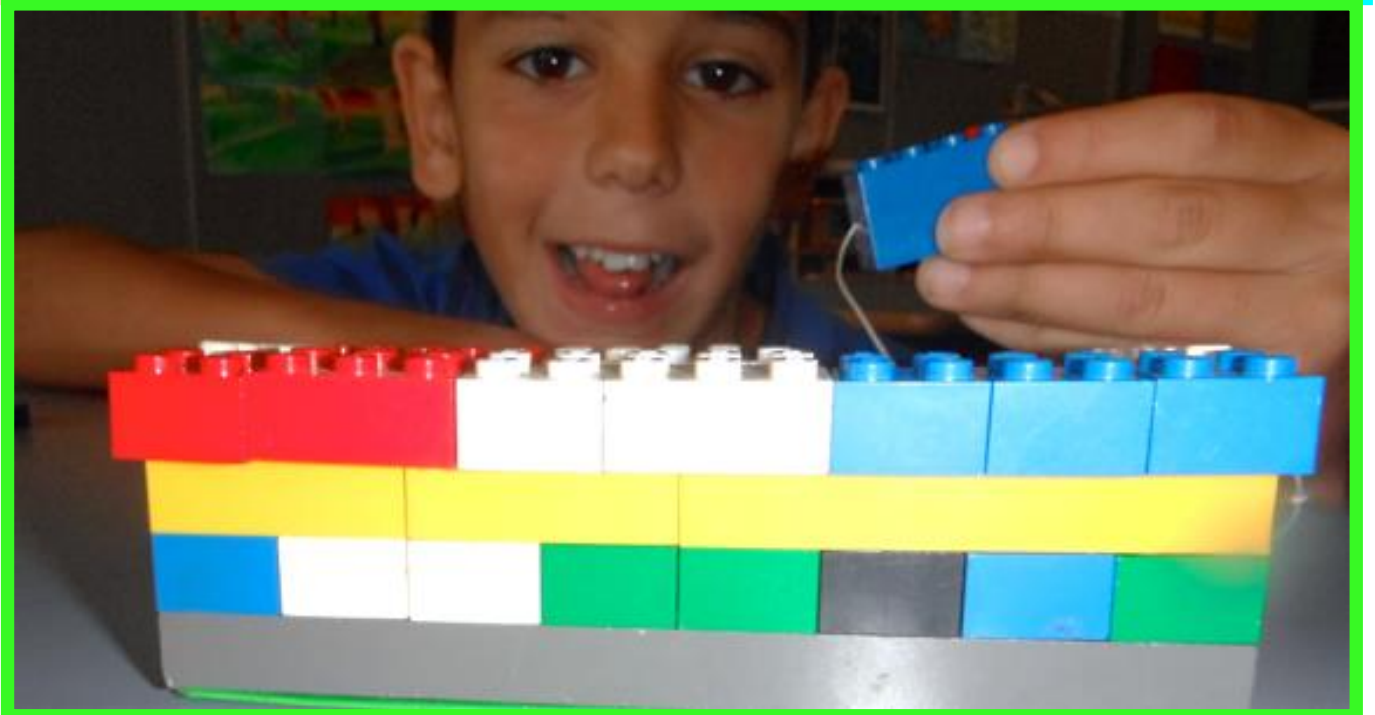
