District Athletics Carnival

The District Athletics Carnival will be held in Narooma on Friday 2 August. Students that have qualified will be given a note this week when we have received all of the details.



Voice, **Treaty**, **Truth** were the themes celebrated during **NAIDOC** week this year. In recognition of NAIDOC week students from all grades K-6 took part in a wide variety of activities designed to enrich their understanding of Indigenous culture.

The students rotated through a number of activities within their stages; some activities focused on exploring the themes Voice, Treaty, Truth and expressing the students ideas in words and through various forms of art.





Some students played Traditional Indigenous games such as Kee'an- a game of throwing skill played in areas of North Queensland and Tarnambai - a game originating from Bathurst Island where children collected the seed heads of the spring rolling grass (spinifex). They took the seed heads to the beach and tossed them into the air where they were blown along by the wind and then chased by the children. Ray Smith and Nellie Johnson from the National Indigenous Australians Agency joined us and introduced the games to the children in grades K-2.



Students in Stage 2 played Indigenous games in the hall.



The children also listened to traditional stories and learned the song 'Manawal Guganyal' a song about five kookaburras in Dhurga, our local Indigenous language. Delicious traditional Johnny Cakes were cooked and eaten and others walked around our local bushland identifying native plants with the help of Emma Patyus from the Eurobodalla Shire Council. Students also had fun making friendship bands and creating a huge fabric collage.





Trish Ellis visited students in Stage 2 and introduced the students to the different tribes from Sydney down as far as Eden. She told local Dreamtime stories and explained the importance of animal totems to Aboriginal people.

Our NAIDOC celebrations culminated in our school assembly being run by our Indigenous students and showcasing some of the activities and art works, including a performance of 'Manawal Guganyal' by K-2 students demonstrating their ability to count to 5 in the Dhurga language.
