Education Week 2020

Education Week (Monday 3 August – Friday 7 August) is an annual, state-wide event that celebrates public education in NSW with an emphasis on students, educators and the communities that support them.

In Education Week 2020, the theme of 'Learning together' is aimed at capturing the vital role the local public school plays as the cornerstone of the local community where teachers, students, parents, carers and the general community gather to learn. Over the past year, the need to 'learn together' remotely has seen the local school become the epicentre of recovery and resilience from the threat of bushfires, floods and the COVID-19 pandemic.

As we cannot have parents in this year due to the COVID-19 restrictions, classes will be videoing a short tour of their classroom and uploading it to their Blog. We will also be presenting our Education Week Certificates to students from each class that demonstrate our FISH values of being Fair, Inclusive, Safe and Honest. These presentations will be done in short infants and primary assemblies which will be videoed and uploaded for everyone.

Stage 2 and 3 Excursions

Currently under COVID-19 restrictions, we are not able to do anything more than a day trip. Due to the organisation of venues (some of which are not taking bookings), the need to give everyone ample notice of the excursion cost and the unpredictable nature of the restrictions, we have made the decision not to go ahead with our planned overnight excursions for Years 3 to 5 this year.

The Year 6 excursion is still being planned as this is their last year and their excursion last year was cancelled on the first day due to fires. Planning is for Year 6 to attend Berry Sport and Rec Camp from 26 – 30 October, if the restrictions allow.

I understand there will be some disappointment amongst the students, but please be assured staff are looking at alternative day trip options for this year.
