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### **Principal's News**

It's hard to believe there are only 2 weeks after this to the end of term. It has been a busy start to the year but there are still a number of events to go before the end of the term. Our big whole school event next week is the Cross Country on Tuesday March 30. Please remember, parents wishing to watch their children will need to go to the parent area where we ask that you observe social distancing.

#### **Teacher Parent Interviews**

Teacher Parent interviews have been taking place this week. If you haven't already booked in a time for your interview please be sure to do so. The interviews are a great way to catch up on your child's progress and how we can work together to continue their development.

#### **NAPLAN Online**

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. During Week 4 of Term 2 (11-12 May) our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format. #### **Attendance Matters**

#### What if my child has to be away from school?

If your child has to be absent from school, *you must tell the school* and provide a reason for your child's absence. To explain an absence parents and carers may be required to:

- send a note or email to the school, or
- telephone the school, or
- visit the school.

A **small** number of absences may be accepted by the principal. For example, if your child:

- has to go to a special religious ceremony
- is required to attend a serious or urgent family situation (e.g. a funeral)
- is too sick to go to school or has an infectious illness Where possible, you should try and make appointments for your children outside of school times.

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## **Complaints Policy**

Complaints Handling Policy Guidelines: I extend a reminder to all that if at any time you find that you have a concern about anything to do with the school, you are encouraged to contact us (phone, email or visit) so that your concern can be resolved. It is our aim to work with all of our school community to ensure that we do the very best we can to ensure an engaging, safe and enriching experience for our students.

However, should you feel that you must raise a concern formally, the NSW Department of Education has procedures to ensure that complaints are handled objectively. A brochure which provides information about "How to Lodge a Complaint" and a Complaint Form are available from the Front Office.


